Thank you for contacting me regarding contract negotiations between Amtrak and the Brotherhood of Maintenance of Way Employee Division of the International Brotherhood of Teamsters.

I appreciate your request for my assistance in settling your labor dispute with Amtrak. It is unfortunate that this dispute has not yet been resolved. I believe my voting record shows consistent support for labor's right to collectively bargain. When labor and management work together, a beneficial and constructive relationship often results, which benefits Pennsylvania's workers and employers alike. However, it has been my long-standing policy to not involve myself in labor-management disputes. I do not believe that it is part of my role as a U.S. Senator to involve myself in the collective bargaining process, whether on behalf of labor or management.

Please know that I recognize the difficulty of this situation. I appreciate your efforts in continuing negotiations and I encourage both sides to continue on in the hard work of coming to an agreement. It is my sincere hope that this dispute is resolved as quickly as possible.
